The Monroe County Library System is pleased to welcome the Blues back to the branches! This year's series celebrates Michigan artists, both past and present. "Tuesdays are Blues Days" returned early with a January concert at the South Rockwood Branch Library, featuring The Good, The Bad & The Blues. Tuesday Bluesdays continue at other branches throughout the month of February and into early March, with new and returning artists including the Flint Southern Aires, Shari Kane and Dave Steele, Carla Cooke Hampton, Airey B and Her Blues Troupe, and Peter "Madcat" Ruth.

Then on Saturday, February 25, 2023, the *Big Gig!* returns live in the Meyer Theater of Monroe County Community College, honoring the memory of longtime blues series organizer, Bill Reiser. The show will celebrate Detroit's rich music heritage with performances by Rev. Robert B. Jones, Sr., Chris Canas, and R.J. Spangler's Blues Review with special guest vocalists Tosha Owens, Sean Carney, and John "T-bone" Paxton.

All concerts are free and open to the public, and begin at 7:00 pm.

No advance tickets are required and seating is first-come, first-served until capacity is reached.













Monroe County's 36th Annual Black History Month Blues Series is presented by the Monroe County Library System, Monroe County Community College, and the 2023 Blues Coalition of community partners: DTE Foundation, Friends of South Rockwood, Friends of Carleton, Friends of Dorsch, Friends of Ellis, Friends of Ida, Friends of Bedford, and Oaks of Righteousness.

This activity is supported by the Michigan Arts and Culture Council.

It is always a joy to share news of multiple organizations coming together to provide outreach and service to the Monroe County community.

This January, the Library was pleased to join with the MCOP and Monroe's Retired Senior Volunteer Program to participate in an area food drive. The project was introduced by the Monroe County RSVP as part of this year's Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service, and helped support seven area food pantries. Pantries included the Bedford Veterans Center, Salvation Army, Oaks of Righteousness, St. Anne's Food Closet, and Monroe County Opportunity Program - which supports Lord's Harvest Pantry and the food RXs in Bedford and Monroe.

Library branches across the county hosted collection boxes. Donations of canned fruits and vegetables, cereal, oatmeal, jelly, jam, pancake mix and syrup, peanut butter, and soup were especially encouraged. It is reported that more than 3,000 food items and \$500 was collected.

It is an honor to be a part of a community that is dedicated to making a positive impact. My thanks and appreciation go out to all of the volunteers and participants who worked to make this drive such a wonderful success.



Each year, One Book, One Community of Monroe County selects a readily available and discussible book written by a major author. Residents are then invited to read the same book at the same time and discuss it through a series of free programs running approximately one month. The Committee is excited to announce that the One Book One Community selection for 2023 is The River by Peter Heller. It is the thrilling and fast-paced story of an excursion by best friends that quickly turns into a desperate struggle for survival.

Wynn and Jack have been best friends since freshman orientation, bonded by their shared love of mountains, books, and fishing. Wynn is a gentle giant, a Vermont kid never happier than when his feet are in the water. Jack is more rugged, raised on a ranch in Colorado where sleeping under the stars and cooking on a fire came as naturally to him as breathing. When they decide to canoe the Maskwa River in northern Canada, they anticipate long days of leisurely paddles and picking blueberries and nights of stargazing and reading paperback Westerns. But a wildfire making its way across the forest adds unexpected urgency to the journey. When they hear a man and woman arguing on the fog-shrouded riverbank and decide to warn them about the fire, their search for the pair turns up nothing and no one. But – the next day a man appears on the river, paddling alone. Is this the man they heard? And, if he is, where is the woman? From this charged beginning, master storyteller Peter Heller, unspools a headlong, heart-pounding story of desperate wilderness survival.

THE BIG GIG! - Monroe County Community College

The *Big Gig!* returns live with a night of down-home Detroit blues featuring Rev. Robert B. Jones, Sr., Chris Canas and his band, and R.J. Spangler's Blues Revue with special guest vocalists Tosha Owens, Sean Carney and John "T-Bone" Paxton.

Rev. Jones, blues and gospel performer and master of ceremonies dating back to the series premier in 1988, is a renowned multi-instrumentalist and inspirational storyteller who celebrates the history and power of American Roots music.

Detroit blues is defined by great guitarists like the late Johnnie Bassett and John Lee Hooker. Guitarist and singer Chris Canas has earned the title of Detroit's "Prince of the Blues," representing the next generation of hard-working blues artists.

R.J. Spangler's big blues band features rhythm section and horns backing the vocal powerhouse team of Tosha Owens, Sean Carney and John "T-Bone" Paxton paying tribute to legendary Detroit blues artists and displaying current sounds of today's artists.

The Big Gig! is an extremely popular event. No advance tickets are

required and seating is general admission, first-come, first-served until Meyer Theater capacity is reached. Doors to the theater will open at 6:00pm and the show begins at 7:00pm sharp.
