Memories of Orchard CEast DIGITAL COMMUNITY ARCHIVE

The Monroe County Library System is pleased to announce an initiative to capture and preserve the vibrant history of the Orchard East neighborhood.

With the launch of "Memories of Orchard East: Digital Community Archive" the Monroe County Library System is striving to ensure the collective memory and heritage of our community is preserved for generations to come. Anyone who has memories or materials related to the Orchard East neighborhood is welcome to participate in this project.

Recognizing that every individual holds a significant piece of the neighborhood's tapestry, the project aims to collect a wide range of stories. From longtime residents who have witnessed the evolution of the Orchard to newcomers who bring fresh perspectives, the library invites everyone to contribute their narratives. The project will encompass a diverse range of themes including family life, work, cultural traditions, community activism, and the transformations the neighborhood has undergone over time.

Oral histories will be collected on Saturday, July 15, 2023 from 9:00am until noon at the L.S. Navarre Branch Library. With the participant's permission, each oral history will be recorded to ensure accuracy and avoid paraphrasing. Memorabilia from the Orchard East neighborhood will also be collected.

The Monroe County Library System has long been dedicated to fostering a sense of belonging and providing resources that reflect the diverse experiences of our patrons. The library has collaborated with local historians, educators, and community organizations to ensure the project's success. The City of Monroe, the Opportunity Center, the Monroe County Museum, and Orchard High School have been particularly helpful in launching this project.
